I. AIM: The purpose of the course is to enable the students to recognize and understand the importance of the topics and stories of classical mythology. The myths which will be analyzed within the academic programme will help the students to interpret the literary texts in accordance with the views of Frazer, Eliade, Freud and Jung and will broaden the students' perspective in their evaluation of a literary text and will let them think about human nature more profoundly.

Week VIII Divinities of Waters and Divinities of Underworld

Week IX Flower Myths, Love Stories

Week X The Heroes: Perseus, Theseus, Hercules

Week XI The Heroes: Achilleus, Hector, Odysseus, Aeneas

Week XII The Trojan War and the Saga of Great Families

Week XIII Stories from The Old Testament

Week XIV Stories from The New Testament

III. TEXTBOOKS: Edith Hamilton's Mythology, Ovidius' Metamorphoses and Robert Graves' The Greek Myths and The White Goddess will be most useful for the students.

IV. METHOD OF INSTRUCTION: The course will be conducted through lecturing, student presentations and class discussion and participation.

V. REQUIREMENTS: Attendance is obligatory. More than 11 hours of absence will result in F1. Students are expected to come to class on time, with the relevant text and having read the assigned material.
